- Did you know that the average age for sex trafficking is **12 to 14 years old**, and the average price for sex is **less than \$100/victim**?
- Did you know that the **Super Bowl** is commonly known as the **single largest human trafficking incident** in the United States?
- Did you know that **Seattle** is part of a trafficking circuit that can include Honolulu, Las Vegas, New Orleans, **Portland**, Vancouver, **Yakima** and Canada?
